




Question 1. Are you a Renter or Owner in the Town of Oliver?



Question 2. How would you rate your understanding of the new provincial housing regulations?




Question 3. How do you perceive the current housing shortage in our community?




Question 4. If you are a property owner in the Town of Oliver, does the allowance of more density impact how you view the potential of your property?
